Proceedings

Agenda 1- Minutes of meeting held on 25.07.2018 were confirmed.

Agenda 2 - At the outset, the Librarian Dr. Sarama Das requested the Principal to relieve her from the Academic Sub-committee since she was overburdened in the Library.

Chairperson Dr. Karpha agreed to consider.

Members resolved that

- It was resolved that for this term in the part I Examination 2019 a 2 hour invigilation duty would be allotted for Honours papers.
- 20, 22, 27, 30 th August It was resolved that classes would be held according to special routine drawn up by the departments on 20th, 22nd, 27th, and 30 th August, 2019.
- All classes would remain suspended on 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 6th of September 2019.
- It was resolved that the topic of Law in SEC syllabus in CBCS Political Science would be conducted by visiting speakers form the Departmentof Law, Adamas University. HOI, Political Science informed that permission had been sought from the Vice Chancellor, Adamas University through Maitreyee Ray Bardhan.
- A series of special lecture would be delivered on SEC topic archives and Museums in history honours (CBCS) by Sutithi Chowdhury, Ex-student GMGC.
- Special Lectures would be arranged by the Philosophy Department.
- Remuneration for special Lecture would be Rs.500/- per hour of lecture
- Special lecture would be conducted in Political Science department on 30th august 2019.
- HOI Geography informed that GIS classes in Geography were not being held and the faculty wished to arrange for 6 lectures in GIS within the sanctioned finance of Rs. 3000.
- Dr. Chandrima Ghosh, Faculty, Political Science suggested a plan for organizing National/international level end of September on article 370. The college would collaborate with Bengal Political Science Association and the funding would be by ICSSR. A proposal to this effect would be drawn up and submitted to the ICSSR for approval
- Student seminar was proposed to be arranged by the History Department where students form other colleges would be invited to present papers.

- Academic calendar to be sent to the College mail for July 2019- December 2019 for Sem-I, Sem III (CBCS) & Third year (Old system).
- To construct new Question Bank keeping in mind the needs of the CBCS batch of students.
- To encourage students to go or internships without hampering classes
- Members proposed that College should provide financial assistance for teachers for attended workshop.
- It was decided that CBCS syllabus workshop in Economics and Education would be organized

Agenda 3: A.O. B.

Discussion on CBCS curriculum related matter.

ASC members opined that the CBCS course curriculum was being followed from July 2018 and it was necessary to draw up the Program Outcomes (POs) and the Course Outcomes (COs) for the CBCS curriculum for all Honours, Major and also the General subjects.

Dr. Sanchita Sen. Convener of ASC and IQAC Coordinator pointed out that POs and COs need to be uploaded in the College website and the link posted in the relevant metric of the AQAR in the new online format. She stated that the POs and COs of the Old syllabus (1+1+1, 2009 & 2016 Reg.) had already been posted in the college website and mentioned in the AQAR 2016-17 that was submitted on 09.08.2019. IQAC would be compiling data for AQAR 2017-18 soon and the PO and CO of old syllabus was already there in the website.

However, for the AQAR of Academic session 2018-19, the POs and COs of the new CBCS curriculum should be drawn up. The third semester was being taught and students had familiarized themselves to a certain extent with the requirements of the semester courses. An



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additional reason mentioned by Dr. Sen - students would get a clear picture of the entire CBCS curriculum, the different topics included, the knowledge to be acquired and prospects of the course. She also mentioned that the IQAC would start compiling the data for AQAR 2018-19 soon after submitting AQAR 2017-18 and would require the POs and COs of the new CBCS curriculum.

It was resolved that the HOI would issue a notice for all departments in this regard. Departments would be asked to send the POs and COs of CBCS curricula to the College mail address and they would be forwarded to the web developer for him to upload in the website.

Dr. S. Sen pointed out that the Department of Chemistry had already conducted a workshop on CBCS curriculum in 2018 for the benefit of the faculty and the students. Similar workshops should be conducted by other departments for efficient delivery of the syllabus. She mentioned that the Department of Economics would invite Dr. Kausik Gupta, Professor of Economics, University of Calcutta to conduct a workshop for the faculty of Economics, GMGC and for teachers from other colleges also, sometime around the first week of March 2020.

Meeting ended with thanks to the chair.
